Police Department Hosts Overnight Camp for At-Risk Youth

The Howard County Police Department is hosting its annual Bear Trax overnight camp this week for children considered “at-risk.” Fifty children ages 10-12 are participating in the camp, which is designed to enhance relationships between police officers and kids in the community.

The camp includes team building and confidence exercises, as well as field trips to Hershey Park and Cascade Lake in Hampstead.

Chief of Police G. Wayne Livesay will host an event for the campers Thursday, July 29, that will include police demonstrations by the K-9 unit, tactical team and helicopter.

The police-youth program also hosts a week-long day camp in July and a holiday party in December.

Nominations for children to participate in Bear Trax programs come from many sources, including police officers and school administrators. Children nominated are those who could most benefit from support, encouragement and constructive, organized activities during the summer months. All camp counselors are police officers, civilian police employees and police department volunteers.
