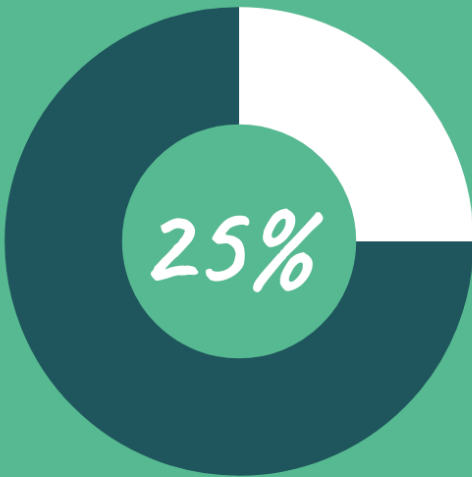


From the 2019 Maryland Public Opinion Survey on Opioids:

# Use and Perception of Cannabis in Maryland



25% of people surveyed used cannabis in the past year.

The most common reasons stated for cannabis use were:



Participants could select more than one response.

Nearly all respondents declined driving under the influence of cannabis in the past 30 days.



only 6% of respondents reported driving after using cannabis.

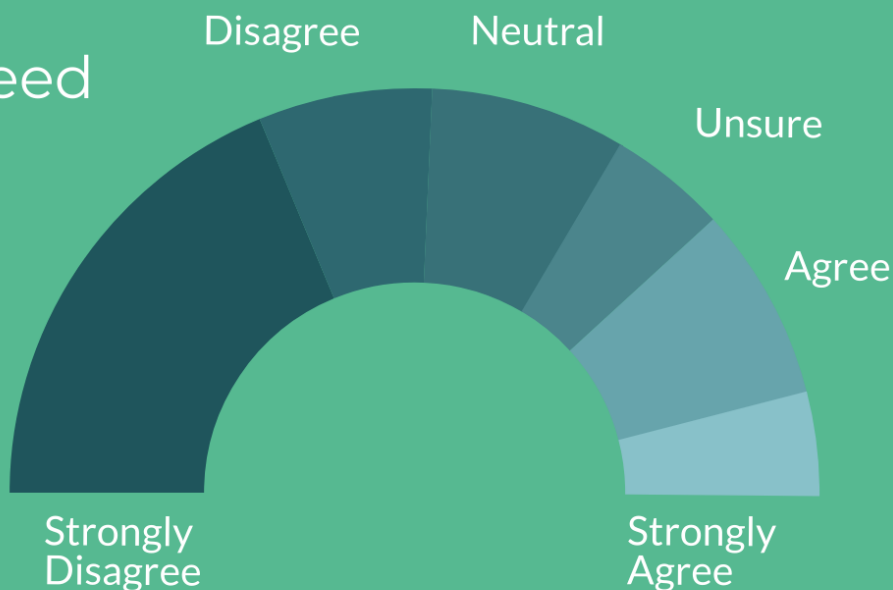

*"It is safer to drive under the influence of marijuana than under the influence of alcohol"*

and most people

*disagreed.*



Less than **10%** of people agreed or strongly agreed that it is safe to drive under the influence of cannabis.



**96%** of people surveyed thought cannabis use is safer than opioid use.
