Fishmobile

The Fishmobile is a mobile aquarium from Phillips Wharf Environmental Center. On-board are 13 tanks and 2 touch tanks in which you can find animals native to the Chesapeake Bay like Diamondback Terrapins, Horseshoe crabs and Northern Pufferfish.

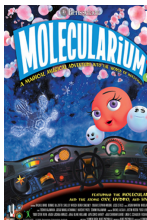
Reptile & Amphibian Presentation

River Treasure Hunt

River Walk

Take a "stroll" down the center of our river guided by lifeguard-certified staff. You must wear close-toed water shoes or old sneakers that can get wet and clothing that can get wet to participate. This walk is on uneven terrain with a river current at your back.

Use natural materials to construct a miniature boat of your own design to float downstream!
