

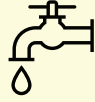
IMPACTED BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN?

Eleven percent of Howard County’s employed residents and their families are directly impacted by the current government shutdown.”

HOWARD COUNTY UTILITIES



The Howard County Department of Finance has suspended residential water service disconnections until the federal government shutdown is over. Howard County has nearly 72,000 residential water and sewer customers. The county bills customers for water and sewer service four times a year, with 30 days to pay. Shut-offs would typically occur after two additional notices have been sent and only on residential accounts with more than \$250 past due. Residents need to take no action to prevent interruption of their water service. For questions, contact the Department of Finance at 410-313-2195.

HOWARD COUNTY LIBRARIES



The Howard County Library System has suspended library fines and fees during the shutdown. No cardholder will be blocked due to fines/fees owed, and fines/fees will not accrue from January 4 through the end of the shutdown. Questions or concerns can be directly to 410-313-7750.

HOWARD COMMUNITY COLLEGE



Howard Community College is assisting families to ensure that college education remains possible. Current or prospective students affected by loss of income should contact the Office of Enrollment Services, where staff will work one-on-one with impacted students. HOWARD COUNTY RECREATION AND PARKS



For impacted federal workers and contractors, the Howard County Department of Recreation and Parks will arrange alternative payment schedules for their fees for recreational classes and access to facilities. To establish an alternate payment schedule, call 410-313-7275.

HOWARD COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM



Howard County families who have lost pay due to the shutdown may immediately apply for the Free and Reduced-Priced Meals (FARMs) program and the Howard County Public School System’s Food and Nutrition Office will determine their eligibility status within 24-48 hours. Families that would not ordinarily qualify for the FARMs program could be eligible for the remainder of the school year because of the current loss of income. Families that are adversely impacted, including those who do not receive FARMs assistance, will have the remainder of the school year to pay off any meal balances incurred during the government shutdown. HOWARD COUNTY FOOD ASSISTANCE



While weekly food distributions have ended, families with continuing needs should contact DCRS directly at 410-313-6400, or the Howard County Food Bank at 410-313-6185. The Howard County Food Bank is continuing to accept donations of non-perishable items including canned and dried fruit, hot and cold cereal, soup, pasta, pasta sauce, tuna, peanut butter, canned beans, canned vegetables, 100% fruit juice and baby food, diapers and wipes.

ASSISTANCE OFFERED BY BGE



BGE is providing a number of options for customers experiencing challenges paying their BGE bill. These include payment arrangements/installment plans, due date extensions, budget billing and deferred service termination. Customers who need assistance paying their BGE bill should contact BGE as soon as possible at 800-685-0123.
